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Important information and deadlines

The first semester of the academic year starts on 21^{st} of September 2009, the second semester starts on 8^{th} of February 2010.

During the first weeks of your exchange stay, it is important to carefully select the courses that you want to follow. On the basis of this, you can change your original learning agreement, which should be approved and registered in time. After you have taken exams, make sure that you collect your transcript of records.

Therefore, the following three stages should be followed:

(1) Selection of courses

- Choose your courses by consulting the course catalogue (see below) and the information that is provided in this document.
- You can find more information about the **contents** of the courses in the electronic **course catalogue** (study guide) of Ghent University:

http://www.opleidingen.ugent.be/studiegids/CURRENT/EN/INDEX.HTM

- All the relevant information about the courses is written in English and Dutch; however, with a few exceptions, most of these courses are actually taught in Dutch (see below)
- The **schedule** of the courses, which indicates where and when they are taking place, can be found at the website of the Student Administration of the Faculty: http://www.ugent.be/ps/nl/onderwijs/lessen.

You can also obtain a paper version of the schedule at the office of the Faculty Student Administration.

- Always contact professors/lecturers: agree on your subscription to the course, on the requirements for exchange students, on the form of examination, on the deadlines etc.
- The number of courses should be equivalent to at least 20 ECTS (min 10 ECTS in the field of study of exchange) per semester.
- For languages courses followed at the language center you will receive a certificate the credits will not be on your transcript of records.
- Deadline for possible changes in learning agreement: see below.
- Please register for every course on Minerva, the e-learning site of our university (see practical information).

(2) Learning agreement

- The final version of your learning agreement has to be signed by departmental co-ordinators, and registered at the Student Administration of the Faculty of Political and Social Sciences.
- Make sure that your learning agreement is approved at home and host institutions
- The learning agreement should be registered at the Faculty Student Administration; deadlines for changes to your learning agreement = **deadlines for definitive learning agreement**

 - 1st of March 2010 (2nd semester courses)

(3) Transcript of records

- The registered courses will appear on **your 'transcript of records'**. When the period of examinations is finished, you can collect this transcript at the Faculty Student Administration (please make an appointment, see below).
- If you did not take an examination and did not inform the Student Administration about this beforehand, the transcript will show that you were 'absent'; if you did not take the examination but informed the Student Administration about this, the transcript will indicate a '0' or 'nra = no results available' for this course. (see regulations concerning examinations below)

End of your stay

- At least one week before their departure, students should contact the Faculty Student Administration (Mrs Irène Creyf and Mr Torsten Dhondt, see above) and make an appointment with them in order to receive the necessary certificates of attendance and the transcript of records. The student is responsible for delivering these documents to the relevant persons at his/her home university.
 - If you fail to make an appointment with the student administration as regards your transcript of records, this document can be send to you by postal mail afterwards. In this case, you should leave the name and address of the contact person at the student administration. However, there may be a significant delay in sending these documents.

Re-examination

- Students who fail their examination can take a re-examination in the second examination period organised at the end of August and the beginning of September.
- In this case you might need to prolong your stay at Ghent University as an exchange student. For details see http://www.ugent.be/en/foreignstud/exchangeprogst/socrates/prolongation.htm/


